






What do you think?

Out of every 10 children entering kindergarten, there is a 3-year range with language and literacy skills.

What do you think? Do you Agree or Disagree.....

Of the students entering behind, 75% of them never catch up with their classmates.

Lowest group of children entering kindergarten have less than a 2% chance of going to college.

Lowest group of children entering kindergarten have a 30% chance of dropping out of high school.

71% of the students who began in the bottom 20 percent when entering Kindergarten are still in the bottom 20% entering 5th grade










Impact in classrooms

Preschoolers using the Seedling Touchpad show a 45% improvement in kindergarten readiness scores




Before Seedling UseAfter Seedling Use

Kindergarten Readiness Assessment



Research showed that after six months using the Seedling, no children were identified as very delayed. Only 18.75% were categorized as delayed. All other children were advanced or average.



- 📒 share and take turns with others




